The Medical Board is considering an update of the policy around this area. It includes the suggested wording below.

"When conducting a physical examination, good medical practice involves:

• Using gloves when examining genitals or conducting internal examinations"

In my opinion, this sentence clearly refers to adult intimate examinations. However, using gloves would be superfluous in the brief examination of the external genitalia of a newborn baby as part of a well baby check; examination of undescended testes in a 5 yr old boy; or parting the labia majora to inspect the vestibular mucosa in a young female child.
